The need for a field hospital?

November is almost upon us and, at that time, we may well have the need for a kind of field hospital to be established for those who are spiritually wounded by the cumulative effects of political 'warfare'.

This hospital needs to be built in our community and manned by groups of believers who seek each in their individual hearts for restoration and a return to our first love, with all that can mean to our wounded world.

As Christians we have a single source of divine authority, manifest in relationship with Jesus and the inner leading of the Holy Spirit. Even so, we may well see the future of our nation and world through different eyes. When the votes are in and the decision is made, we need to lift those eyes from what is seen to what is unseen and to believe that God will turn all things together for good.

This future 'good' will become our immediate challenge and it is here that the wounded need to find healing in the belief that God is not finished yet. Ultimately our hope doesn't rest in the political system or who holds which office, but rather in the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Our return to this healthy understanding will allow us to get back to another race which matters deeply, the one marked out for us to run, where we fix our eyes upon Jesus and where we relearn, from his example, how to love one another.

It is therefore a time to pray and to act; as well as to ponder the path that leads forward: including how we might be useful in this 'field hospital' where we currently live.

As individuals we can pray for peace and unity, or reach out to someone you love who is on the other "side" and establish now that your relationship will survive whatever divisions may come on the national scale. And we can also act as the church, for example, we might call together a panel of believers who represent both of the main parties and who are, as individuals, concerned about the possible disorder that may be exacerbated by the results. As sincere, well-meaning believers they could work toward a consensus, as to the pathways that might lead to reconciliation and agreement on a way forward for a more united Body of Christ. This effort at dialog and understanding may serve to mitigate the potentially violent reaction from
