A New Year's Reflection

My family had a great New Year's getaway to Tall Timber for Snow Camp. During the day there were all sorts of new experiences for us: a hike through the woods to a waterfall for my kids' first time snowshoeing; I tried cross country skiing for the first time... I still have a bruise from one particularly hard fall.

A few photos of the days grace a later page of this newsletter, but the pictures on this page are my favorites from each of the two nights we

were there. On New Year's Eve, there was a firework display to rival many I've seen. The camp director told us there were 95 shells of up to 4 inch diameter... the echo from the explosions reverberated between the peaks in the valley. It was quite a way to ring in the New Year!

The night before I was also treated to a clear night sky at camp. The stars were amazing. I ventured out with my camera to try to capture what I could of that particular slice of the beauty of God's creation. It was cold... and it was thought provoking. I let my mind wander to scripture as I wandered looking for a good photo. God's promise to Abraham came to the fore "I will bless you, and I will make your offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven." I realized some of the stars I saw that night were likely some of the same ones Abraham saw when he looked up so many years ago. They became for me a witness to the constancy of God's presence.

And then a different scripture from Isaiah 43:19 popped into my head and it created a little tension because it's all about what's new rather than what remains constant... Isaiah reports the Lord saying "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (cont. next page)

News from Friendship House

In early 2016 the Friendship House Board of Directors purchased a rental property which was the beginning of a place called "Barbara's House". Over the next two years the property was transformed from a sell-worn rental house



into a comfortable living space with 5 –single units with shared bath and kitchen facilities available for lease as permanent housing for those on Social Security or Disability Insurance with low income that had completed the resident program at Friendship House. From the first day all five units were filled. Barbara's House has proven itself to be a concept that works. The following is from a resident:

"I want to say thank you from the bottom of my heart to all the staff at Friendship House for believing in me and caring so much to give me a beautiful home and a new life. I doubt that I would still be here if not for them all."

In other news:

Recently, after much discussion with neighbors of Friendship House, the Mayor's office and the Mount Vernon Police Department, the Friendship House Board of Directors made the decision to stop serving breakfast and lunch to the public as of October 1st. Friendship House began a mobile meal service providing a sack lunch to anyone who is hungry at a site outside the immediate neighborhood. Currently the mobile lunch effort continues everyday with a sack lunch available from Noon to 1:00 pm on West Fir Street in Mount Vernon across from the Carpet One Floor and Home store.

Thank you to all who helped make our Christmas program an enjoyable celebration of Jesus' birth!





















Talk to Pat Papadopulos if you have any questions about the Prayer Team, or just about praying in general.






Volunteers are welcomed to help search, organize and sort, reminisce and file as they explore the old church records for interesting 'nuggets' of our history. The following skills would be helpful:
