Easter Worship Service April 4th 10:30 am Zoom Meeting Room 1 Invite your family and friends! A few years back at a retreat of the Session of MVPC, the elders were asked to consider what we do as a congregation and why we do it. With each answer that was given we again asked ... "and why do we do that?" or "Why is that important?" As you can imagine there were many reasons given for the many activities and practices of the church but the place where there seemed to be convergence of purpose was with the statement: "We do what we do in order to know God's love and to share it with other people."

Session talked at length about what that means and developed four priorities for the congregation that will help us to live more fully into our purpose. The priorities are:

- Biblical Literacy,
- A Deepening Life of Prayer and Discernment,
- Caring Relationships and
- Unified Mission.

We decided that we would seek to use the existing groups of the church to help everyone grow in relationship to the priorities in order that we might, more fully, know God's love and share it!

In an effort to shed a little light on what those priorities mean, some of the leadership of the congregation have agreed to write a primer on the subject from their perspective. Last month Dave Gale shared with us about Biblical Literacy. This month (and in a coming series in the *Grapevine*) Rebecca Holland writes about a Deepening Life of Prayer and Discernment.

Deepening Life of Prayer and Discernment: Prayers We Know By Heart

I have been invited to share what it means to have a deepening life of prayer and discernment. In the journey of faith, prayer and discernment not only draw us closer to God, but they open our lives to transformation, as only God is able to do. To have a deepening life of prayer and discernment is to say yes to God and to all that God calls you to do and be in life. Prayer can calm, focus, and transform our lives, helping us to discern God's will for us. So, how do we "deepen" the prayer and discernment in our lives? There are so many ways! We are going to have an ongoing section in the Grapevine that highlights a different way to deepen your life of prayer and discernment every month.

Let's begin with those prayers we hold in our hearts. Most of us have memorized a prayer or two. There's "Now I lay me down to sleep...", "God is great, God is good...", "For what we are about to eat...", and so many more. Take a moment to think of the prayers you grew up learning and the prayers you continue to pray, whether before a meal or as you head to bed or before you travel or whenever you find yourself saying a prayer. What prayers do you know by heart and say regularly? How have these prayers helped to shape who you are? To "deepen" these prayers, take a moment to think about what the prayers mean to you and as you find yourself praying them, take a moment to not just say the words, but to let yourself dive deeper into the meaning of the words, the memories the prayers hold for you, and what the prayers might be calling you toward in your life today. Are there other prayers you feel called to learn by heart to add to your life of prayer?

One of the most memorized prayers we all know by heart, is one we say together as a congregation, every Sunday in Worship, joining together to pray the prayer Jesus called us to pray, the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For Thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

To "deepen" this prayer, take time to think about each line and what it means. Not just what it means logically, but what it means if you really let it into your heart. Read the words and let them transform who you are right now, today. Carry them with you always, not just as you find yourself connected to others as we say the prayer together in worship, but as you are connected to all of the people of faith of the past, present, and future. The deeper you let these prayers you know by heart enter into your heart and your life, the more powerful they become in transforming your life and drawing you closer to God.

Looking Forward at MVPC: A call to congregational meeting 4/18/21

The funding for our Forward to a Bright Future Capital Campaign was sufficient to address nearly all of the priorities for the exterior of the building. With the Covid-19 closures, our day to day functioning was essentially not affected by the repairs. Over the last year, we've learned to be church together online, which is no small feat for our congregation! And, while we miss being in person, it's also been great to see how God has worked in our church and in our community even throughout this less-than-ideal season where we have been forced to be distant.

With the vaccine distribution ramping up and the construction on the exterior of the building winding down, we all want to be able to worship in person together as soon and as safely as possible. At the same time, MVPC is in a unique position right now. We have been presented with a window of opportunity, while there is still uncertainty about whether the risks of Covid have diminished enough to re-open the building safely, there is also the time to take further steps toward the *Bright Future into which God is inviting us*.

This window of opportunity can allow for four things to happen simultaneously.

- 1. Installation of an upgraded communication system to offer hybrid (in-person and online) worship services when the building is reopened.
- 2. Sanctuary upgrades with new lighting, paint, carpet and audio/visual equipment so that when the building re-opens the interior will look as good as the exterior now does!
- 3. Volunteer training so that when our building does re-open, our processes will be smooth and volunteers will be ready.
- 4. Resolution of the few issues not addressed in the scope of the exterior phase of the building project.

Before the Session decides whether to take advantage of this window of opportunity we wanted to consult with and hear input from the congregation because it would mean two things for the congregation:

- 1. The reopening of the church building for Sunday morning worship would likely be pushed out into the future by a number of months while the interior work on the Sanctuary is completed.
- 2. We would extend our Forward to a Bright Future capital campaign for one year and seek additional pledges to fund the work in number 2 and 4 above. (Point 1 is already funded by a grant from our Presbytery.)

To receive congregational input, MVPC will be having a <u>congregational meeting after worship on Zoom on 4/18/2021.</u>

More detailed information will be made available to the congregation before the congregational meeting.

March 2021 Session Notes

- * Session opened with prayer and check in.
- * Reports were received and previous minutes approved
- * The financial report showed a monthy difference of (\$6276.51). Year to date difference through February is (\$8425.78).
- * Regretfully received the report from Deacons that Colleen Higbee, moderator is stepping down from the position of Deacon. A thank you from Session is being sent.
- * Passed a motion to move toward a new session structure to distinguish the roles of goverance and program ministry. Elders have been delegated to investigate the path ahead.
- * Approved a motion to spend up to \$2400 dollars from the hospitality budget to replace 50 year old heavy dinnerware (plates and cups) with lighter weight items.
- * Approved a motion to upgrade to new internet provider, increasing broadband width and wireless capabilities ASAP.



The Genesis Process

(a program used by New Earth Recovery for understanding and healing of compulsive behaviors)

Alan and Amy Muia will be leading a full Genesis Counselor Training soon, April 26-29th. "It will be fully interactive, in real-time but online." I participated in this zoom training last October, and learned so much about how addiction works for others and, of course, for myself. I now feel encouraged and supported enough to work with clients who are in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction. These clients encourage me with their persistent hope and trust in God.

The Genesis Process also has a program that encourages small groups to explore their own stuck places. In the future, I would love to bring a group together at MVPC for those interested in understanding our compulsive behaviors. "Though many come to help others, attenders often find healing for themselves".

Hi there. My name is Alvin Shim, the new One Parish One Prisoner Coordinator at Underground Ministries. I'm in Room 3 here inside MVPC, surrounded by white boards, post-its, and hot cups of coffee.

My role, as I see it, is to be the logistics muscle behind One Parish One Prisoner. I coordinate the resources that help get the players to the table. There are 15 post-its on the board here, meaning there are fifteen active relationships with a recently-incarcerated individual and a congregation in their release area. On the next whiteboard, there are 25 unpaired players to match. Lots of work to do to on-board them, find timelines and locations that fit, and pray that the Spirit continues to set the work before us.

Next to those post-its are bigger ones: Los Angeles, New Jersey, Sacramento, Chicago. Pre-assembled networks of chaplains, parole officers, staff at synod, archdiocese, presbytery, etc. that love the incarcerated and call on us to plug and play our system into their regions. We got off the Zoom yesterday with NW Ohio this week. The team knew about incarceration. They worked faithfully in accompaniment to the despair that it brings to the individual and the system. They wanted, "to see some things handled differently."

We begin the first run of One Parish One Prisoner: Ohio this week. Two weeks ago, we began the first run with Hagar's Community Church, serving the Washington Corrections Center for Women.

We've got work to do. We're gonna need more white boards.

Thank you, Mount Vernon Presbyterian Church. This space is a very generous gift, and we are putting it to use! May God inform and enable our work.
